Housing in the European Union

The Action Plan of the Housing Partnership

- Adopted at the last Partnership meeting in December 2018 in Vienna
- Endorsed by the Ministers for Urban Affairs in June 2019 in Bukarest
- Referred to by reports and opinions of the European Committee of the Regions (2017), European Social and Economic Committee (2019) and European Parliament (2021)
- Member States level: Housing mentioned as central element of the New Leipzig Charter (2020)
- Noted on UN-level at UNECE HLM meetings and UN Forum of Mayors

A crisis-proof Action Plan

Corona pandemic reinforced many of the suggested policy recommendations



Better regulation

Goal: De-blocking investment for affordable housing

- HP proposes change in EU state aid as narrow definition of target group for social housing is contradicting principle of subsidiarity
- DG COMP launched a consultation and an evualation of SGEI/EU state aid in 2021
- Action Leaders of the HP sent letter with their contribution to this to VP Vestager

Window of opportunity - Challenge

 Corona crisis management allowed for more favourable conditions with regard to state aid – is this here to stay as a principle?



Better funding and financing

Goal: Diverse and protective housing systems

- HP suggests to improve uptake of EU funding and financing by cities and changes in the European Semester to respond to housing needs
- Commission launched EU renovation wave with an Affordable Housing Initiative, the New European Bauhaus Movement and suggestions to combat homelessness and energy poverty
- EIB works to include housing in the Sustainability Awareness Bonds

Window of opportunity - challenge

 MFF and RRF could allow for better EU funding – but there is little involvement of cities in the NRPs



Better knowledge and governance

Goal: A more evidence-based housing policy on EU-level

- HP proposes more exchange, capacity building, better subnational data and a sound monitoring system
- UIA and URBACT, JRC, EIGE and HP Action Leaders contribute to more knowledge on housing – Eurocities pledges, HE State of Housing report, IUT body of work on tenants' rights
- DE-EU produced study on housing in EU 27, PT-EU organised conference on housing in the EU

Window of opportunity - challenge

Social Scoreboard to link housing to the European Semester,
Commission to engender its database on energy poverty.
