





Potential of decentralized country

Urbanism (and many other public policies) competencies lay at regional level-Comunidades Autonómas:

→ 17 Laws on Land

17 Regional legal frameworks, advance different issues:

- Access to land (Galizia, Catalunya...)
- Protection of agricultural land (C. Valenciana...) planning (Canarias, Euskadi..)
- Protection of family farming (Castilla La Mancha)
- Connections with other plans (Green infrastructure, innovation, etc)







Potential of decentralized country With a common background

Common trunk (Law 1956): shared principles:

- General interest as a guiding principle
- Social function of private propriety
- Compulsory transfers (for public facilities, etc.) and capital gains are shared with society
- Gradual process rights // obligations
- Municipal zoning plans are mandatory
- -> ease the path for Exchange and Learning


